Article 29 - Every child has the right to use and develop their talents and abilities.

- Approaching lessons in different ways
- Providing a range of after school clubs
- Having a choir and sports teams
- Providing opportunities to share talents with others in assemblies.

Article 31 - Every child has the right to relax, rest and play.

- Providing all children with regular breaks in safe environments.
- Having a range of equipment in the playground for children to play with
- Inviting others to join in our games so everybody has a friend to play with.

St John & St James' C of E Primary School is a Rights Respecting School. This means we place the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) at the heart of everything we do and it is evident within the school community. There are 54 articles in the convention.

As a school we promote children's rights and empower them to become global citizens. The UNCRC recognises that all children around the world are entitled to these rights.

Article 14 - Every child has the right to choose their own religion and beliefs.

Article 19 - Every child has the right to be protected from being hurt and mistreated, in body or in mind.

- Adults in the playground during playtime and lunchtimes.
- Trained First Aid staff
- Pastoral manager for children to talk to
- All staff have agreed to, and signed the Safeguarding Policy.
- Have a worry box for children to voice how they feel and raise any concerns they may have.
- Safe and clean classrooms and playgrounds
- Peer Mediators in the playground

Article 24 - Every child has the right to the best health care possible, safe water to drink, nutritious food and a clean and safe environment.

- Having access to safe water to drink inside the classroom and outside in the playground.
